PURPOSE OF GAIP

- Completion of Terminal C, Parking Structure C and related commercial air service infrastructure in 2011
- Character of general aviation (level of activity and types of aircraft) has changed significantly since JWA's last planning initiative in 1990
 - ✓ Decrease in operation of smaller, single engine aircraft
 - ✓ Increase in operation of larger, corporate jets
- Most general aviation-related leases have expired
- Consistent with Board of Supervisors commitment to provide high quality services and facilities
 - Mission Statement: "Making Orange County a safe, healthy, and fulfilling place to live, work, and play, today and for generations to come by providing outstanding, cost-effective regional public services."



DETAILED PLANNING ASSUMPTIONS

- Provide for compliance with applicable FAA regulations (obstructions, aircraft movement, etc.)
- Design for up to three (3) full-service FBOs
- Maintain, where possible, number and type of general aviation based aircraft facilities (hangars & tiedowns) comparable to existing
- Provide, where possible, separate facilities for OCSD Air Support, independent charter operators and flight schools
- Evaluate feasibility of providing General Aviation Facility (GAF) for inspection of international arrivals and general aviation-specific terminal uses
- Maintain on-site piston engine maintenance facilities/services
- Retain existing general aviation fuel farm (SE corner of airfield)
- Provide self-service fueling facilities for smaller, independent general aviation operators
- Where possible, segregate vehicle service road and taxilane



PRÍOR OUTREACH

- Spring/summer of 2015: JWA Planning Team met with on-airport GAIP stakeholders.
- The following stakeholder suggestions were incorporated into project alternatives:
 - Self-service fueling facility (AvGas)
 - Stand-alone flight school facility
 - Option for 3 FBOs
 - Option to show a mix of large and small hangars
 - Maintain all existing GA components (Flight schools, aircraft maintenance, rental aircraft, FBO's, fueling etc.)
- November 2016: Interviews and Online Survey with JWA based aircraft owners







ALTERNATIVES FOR EVALUATION

Proposed Project: Two (2) full-service FBOs (east and west)

Alternative 1: Three (3) full-service FBOs (two east, one west)

Alternative 2: Two (2) full-service FBOs (both on east)

Alternative 3: Two (2) full-service FBOs (existing locations, but require

improvements to better comply with FAA regulations)

Alternative 4: "No project"

- Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR)
 - Second quarter 2018.
