NEW BUSINESS:

1. The City of Newport Beach - The Residences at 1401 Quail Street

The City of Newport Beach has submitted a proposal to amend the Land Use Element of the General Plan and the Newport Place Planned Community to allow for The Residences at 1401 Quail Street.

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Commission find the proposed Residences at 1401 Quail Street, the City of Newport Beach General Plan (Land Use) Amendment and Newport Place Planned Community Amendment inconsistent with the *AELUP for JWA* per:

- 1) Section 2.1.1 Aircraft Noise that the "aircraft noise emanating from airports may be incompatible with general welfare of the inhabitants within the vicinity of an airport."
- 2) Section 2.1.2 Safety Compatibility Zones in which "the purpose of these zones is to support the continued use and operation of an airport by establishing compatibility and safety standards to promote air navigational safety and to reduce potential safety hazards for persons living, working or recreating near JWA."
- 3) Section 3.2.1 General Policy (in pertinent part): "Within the boundaries of the AELUP, any land use may be found to be Inconsistent with the AELUP which: (1) Places people so that they are affected adversely by aircraft noise, [or] (2) Concentrates people in areas susceptible to aircraft accidents..."

2. The City of Newport Beach - 1400 Bristol Street Residences

The City of Newport Beach has submitted a proposal to amend the Land Use Element of the General Plan and the Newport Place Planned Community to allow for the 1400 Bristol Street Residences.

<u>Recommendation</u>: That the Commission find the proposed 1400 Bristol Street Residences, the City of Newport Beach General Plan (Land Use) Amendment and Newport Place Planned Community Amendment inconsistent with the *AELUP for JWA* per:

- 1. Section 2.1.1 Aircraft Noise that the "aircraft noise emanating from airports may be incompatible with general welfare of the inhabitants within the vicinity of an airport."
- 2. Section 2.1.2 Safety Compatibility Zones in which "the purpose of these zones is to support the continued use and operation of an airport by establishing compatibility and safety standards to promote air navigational safety and to reduce potential safety hazards for persons living, working or recreating near JWA."
- 3. Section 3.2.1 General Policy (in pertinent part): "Within the boundaries of the AELUP, any land use may be found to be Inconsistent with the AELUP which: (1) Places people so that they are affected adversely by aircraft noise, [or] (2) Concentrates people in areas susceptible to aircraft accidents..."

4. Status of Determinations of Inconsistency

- a) City of Los Alamitos 2021-2029 Housing Element Update
 - Found Inconsistent on January 19, 2023.
 - Public hearing on August 21, 2023. Overrule failed with a 3-2 vote.
- b) City of Santa Ana Related Bristol Specific Plan
 - Found Inconsistent on July 20, 2023.
 - ALUC received Notice of Intent to Overrule on August 31, 2023.
 - ALUC comments submitted on October 24, 2023.
- c) City of Newport Beach Housing Element Implementation/Noise-Related Amendments
 - Found Inconsistent on August 17, 2023.
 - ALUC received Notice of Intent to Overrule on September 13, 2023.
 - ALUC comments sent on October 12, 2023.
 - Overruled on November 14, 2023.

5. Items of Interest to the Commissioners

Commissioners may comment on agenda or non-agenda matters, and ask questions of or give direction to staff, provided that no action may be taken on off-agenda items.

6. Items of Interest to the Public
